Cane Quest seeks to motivate blind and visually impaired youth to practice proper safe travel techniques. As they traverse the contest route, participants will show their understanding of orientation and mobility skills vital to living independently with a vision impairment. Cane quest is designed to build students' confidence in any situation, while providing some fun competition along the way.
