FBC Awarded Grant from Nina Mason Pulliam Charitable Trust to Advance Research

Phoenix—Foundation for Blind Children (FBC) was recently awarded a grant from the Nina Mason Pulliam Charitable trust to hire a Research Advancement Administrator (RAA.) The RAA will identify research opportunities to advance our understanding of our teaching methods. The RAA will partner with other organizations and universities to study FBC's methods, with the goal of publishing its standardized framework for other organizations to model.

Data will be gathered from FBC's population of nearly 2,000 students, ranging in age from newborns to the elderly. Research findings will help FBC improve educational outcomes. In addition, FBC will present research to conferences, educational organizations, and advocacy groups to broaden the knowledge in the wider visually impaired community.
