Additionally, many kids may be resistant to new tastes or textures, and the Sharing Feast provides a safe, comfortable environment for them to explore new things.

It's not just the kiddos though. FBC's adult students will also be putting on their own holiday Stone Soup potluck. They will prepare and serve their own meal, showcasing the adaptive living skills they learn in FBC's **Adult Program**.
